### **ORDINANCE 21-06**

# AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE USE OF GOLF CARTS ON CERTAIN DESIGNATED CITY STREETS

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WHEREAS, KRS 189.286 was enacted by the Kentucky General Assembly which authorizes the use of golf carts on certain city streets;

WHEREAS, the City's Public Safety Committee proposes an ordinance providing for the use of golf carts on certain city streets within the City of Campbellsville;

WHEREAS, KRS 189.286 authorizes the City to regulate the operation of a golf cart on any public roadway under its jurisdiction if the City adopts an ordinance specifying each roadway that is open for golf cart use; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Campbellsville, deems it appropriate and necessary to formally adopt the provisions of KRS 189.286.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CAMPBELLSVILLE, KENTUCKY AS FOLLOWS:

### 1. **DEFINITIONS**

As used in this ordinance, the term "GOLF CART" means any self-propelled vehicle that:

- a. Is designed for the transportation of players or maintaining equipment on a golf course, while engaged in the playing of golf, supervising the play of golf, or maintaining the condition of the grounds of a golf course;
- b. Has a minimum of four (4) wheels;
- c. Is designed to operate at a speed of not more than thirty-five (35) miles per hour;
- d. Is designed to carry not more than six (6) persons, including the driver;
- e. Has a maximum gross vehicle weight of two thousand five hundred (2,500) pounds;
- f. Has a maximum rated payload capacity of one thousand two hundred (1,200) pounds; and
- g. Is equipped with the following:
  - i. Headlamps;

- ii. Tail lamps;
- iii. Stop lamps;
- iv. Front and rear turn signals;
- v. One (1) red reflex reflector on each side as far to the rear as practicable, and one (1) red reflex reflector on the rear;
- vi. An exterior mirror mounted on the driver's side of the vehicle and either an exterior mirror mounted on the passenger's side of the vehicle or an interior mirror;
- vii. A parking brake;
- viii. For each designated seating position, a seatbelt assembly that conforms to the federal motor vehicle safety provided in 4 49 C.F.R. sec. 571.209; and
- ix. A horn that meets the requirements of KRS 189.080

## 2. STREETS DESIGNATED FOR GOLF CART USE

a. Golf Carts may be operated on any roadway in the City of Campbellsville whose speed limits are twenty-five (25) miles per hours or less, excepting any roadway maintained by the Commonwealth of Kentucky Transportation Cabinet and those portions of any other roadways that cross a state-maintained highway on which the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet has determined that the prohibition of the use of golf carts is necessary in the interest of public safety.

## 3. REQUIREMENTS FOR OPERATION

In order to be operated on such designated streets, a golf cart shall:

- a. Meet all requirements for a golf cart defined in KRS 189.286(1)(a), as may be amended;
- b. Be issued a permit for the golf cart by the Campbellsville Police Department at a cost of twenty-five (\$25.00) per golf cart permit application. The Chief of Police, or designee, shall prepare an application form for the permit request. Renewals for permits shall be due on or before January fifteenth (15<sup>th</sup>) of each year. There shall be no proration of the fee for any permit issued after January fifteenth (15<sup>th</sup>) and all permits issued after January fifteenth (15<sup>th</sup>) shall expire on January fifteenth (15<sup>th</sup>) the following year. Insurance and proof of inspection by a certified inspector shall be presented prior to issuance of an official permits. Permits issued for 2022 will include 2021 applications for permits;
- c. Display an official permit issued by the Campbellsville Police Department and affixed to the lower left side (driver's side) of the windshield of the golf cart;

- d. Be inspected by a certified inspector designated by the Taylor County Sheriff's Office and certified through the Department of Vehicle Regulation to ensure that the golf cart complies with the requirements of this section. The inspection fee under this subsection shall not exceed five dollars (\$5.00) if the inspection occurs at the sheriff's office with an additional fee not to exceed ten dollars (\$10.00) per trip charged if it becomes necessary for the certified inspector to travel to the site of the golf cart rather than having the golf cart brought to the sheriff's office;
- e. The golf cart displays a slow-moving vehicle emblem in compliance with KRS 189.820;
- f. The golf cart shall be insured in compliance with KRS 304.39-.080 by the owner or operator, and the proof of insurance shall be inside the golf cart at all times of operation on a public roadway;
- g. The operator of the golf cart does not cross a roadway at an intersection where the roadway being crossed has a posted speed limit of more than thirty-five (35) miles per hour;
- h. Any person operating a golf cart on a public roadway under the provisions of this section shall be subject to the traffic regulation of KRS Chapter 189 and any other state law:
- i. Be operated only between sunrise and 10:30 p.m.; and
- j. Be operated by a person with a valid operator's license in his or her possession.

## 4. EXEMPTIONS

- a. A golf cart operating under the provisions of this article is not considered to be a motor vehicle and is exempt from:
  - i. Title requirements of KRS 186.020;
  - ii. Vehicle registration requirements of KRS 186.050; and
  - iii. Emissions compliance certificates pursuant to KRS 224.20-720.
- b. The provisions of this article shall not apply to a golf cart that is not used on a public roadway except to cross a roadway while following a golf cart path on a golf course.

### 5. **PENALTIES**

- a. Anyone violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of no less than \$25.00 and no more than \$150.00 for each violation, plus any court costs which may be imposed.
- b. Any person receiving three (3) violations in a three-month period shall be subject to having their permit revoked for a period of not less than six (6) months.
