CITY ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE KEEPING OF LIVESTOCK AND POWL WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF CAMPBELLSVILLE, KENTUCKY, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CAMPBELLSVILLE, KENTUCKY, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful to keep any type of livestock within the City limits of the City of Campbellsville, Kentucky, at any place, (except at the present location of the Taylor County Stockyards), within one hundred yards of any residence, or under any conditions that render a situation offensive to the general public.

Section 2. When any livestock or fowl are kept within the City limits of the City of Campbellsville, except in transit, under such conditions as to create offensive odors or the breeding of flies, or any other unhealthy condition, and complaint is made by any individual to the Health Department or to the public officials, and notice is given to such persons keeping said livestock or fowl, the same shall be removed immediately.

Section 3. Any person violating any section of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not more than \$10.00 for each offense, and each day livestock or fowl are kept in violation of this Ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances, that conflict herewith are repealed to the extent of such conflict with this Ordinance.
